

## 2018 Statewide Ballot Question Positions

Amendment V would lower the age of eligibility to serve in the Colorado Amendment V NP General Assembly from 25 to 21. Amendment W would shorten the ballot language for judicial retention Amendment W elections by eliminating repetitive language. Amendment X would remove language from the state Constitution Amendment X defining hemp and instead use the federal definition. Amendment Y would create a non-partisan Independent Commission Amendment Y responsible for conducting congressional redistricting Amendment Z would create a non-partisan Independent Commission Amendment Z responsible for conducting state legislative reapportionment. Amendment A would abolish the provision in Colorado's constitution Amendment A that allows slavery and involuntary servitude to exist. Amendment 73 would increase funding for public schools by raising the Amendment 73 individual income tax rate for those with a taxable income above \$150,000. Amendment 74 would allow any corporation to sue local governments Amendment 74 based on perceived reduction of market value on private property. Amendment 75 would allow contribution limits to be increased x5 Amendment 75 when a candidate contributes \$1 million or more to their own campaign. Proposition 109 would require the Colorado Department of **Proposition 109** Transportation to borrow TRANS bonds to complete 66 listed projects. Proposition 110 would increase state sales and use tax 0.62% for 20 **Proposition 110** years to provide funding for statewide transportation projects. Proposition 111 would stop predatory payday lending by reducing and **Proposition 111** capping payday loans at 36% APR including interest rates and fees.

Western Colorado Alliance did not take positions on ballot measures it does not have existing policy on.

Proposition 112 would require new oil and gas drilling to be set back

2,500 feet from neighborhoods and schools. This does not ban fracking.
