PROPOSITION 123

Dedicate Revenue for Affordable Housing Programs

Proposition 123 tackles Colorado's housing shortage by funding large-scale construction of affordable housing - designed to increase affordable homes supply 3% each year. Without increasing taxes a "Yes" vote dedicates 0.1% of state income taxes to invest up to \$300M each year into the following:

- Affordable housing construction
- Land purchases for affordable housing construction
- Financing programs that reduce rent costs
- Financing help for affordable housing builders
- Homeless transition programs

This money is locally-controlled as local governments, non-profits, and affordable housing organizations apply to access this funding and oversee the projects. Proposition 123 does not increase taxes but lowers your TABOR refund. It is estimated that the TABOR refund reduction for the average Colorado taxpayer would be \$43-\$86 per year.

PROPOSITION GG

Amount of Tax Owed for Initiatives

Proposition GG creates a new requirement that future Colorado ballot initiatives impacting taxes will display new information. If passed, voters would receive a table breakdown of the numbers showing the average cost impact for taxpayers based on their income. This will help you see whether lower- or upper- income earners are more impacted and who benefits most.

PROPOSITION FF Healthy School Meals for All

Proposition FF funds free, nutritious meals to all Colorado public school students. Some children from the lowest-income homes receive school meals support, but many children from working and middle-income families do not. Right now, more than 60,000 kids in Colorado can't afford school meals, but don't qualify for free or reduced-price lunches. Proposition FF funds meals for all kids. The Proposition provides grants to schools that also include support for sourcing food from local farmers, upgrading food equipment, and training staff to make more nutritious meals from scratch. This is a win-winwin for student health and grades, local farmers, and our communities.

Proposition FF raises roughly \$100M a year by reducing the tax deductions received by the top 3% of Colorado income earners. Coloradans earning below \$300,000 won't pay new taxes.

STATE INCOME TAX RATE REDUCTION

Proposition 121 would reduce the state income tax rate. The permanent rate would be reduced from 4.55 percent of income to 4.40 percent of income. It follows a ballot measure that reduced state income taxes from 4.63% in 2020.

While Proposition 121 looks attractive, it benefits wealthy people more than working-class people. Someone making \$79,000 a year would save just \$119. Someone making one million a year would save \$1,500. This reduction would cost the rest of us \$400M in cuts every year to state resources for schools and teachers, police and firefighters, and roads.
