Amendment 79	What it Does: Guarantees access to abortion in the state of Colorado through a constitutional amendment.	$\mathcal{C}\mathcal{L}$
Right to Abortion	<b>Why We Support It:</b> Reproductive healthcare is healthcare, it keeps our communities strong, healthy, and everyone deserves the right to medical decisions for their own bodies.

Amendment J Protecting the Freedom to Marry	<ul> <li>What it Does: Removes language in Colorado's constitution stating marriage is only valid between one man and one woman.</li> <li>Why We Support It: Our constitution should reflect the right</li> </ul>	
	to make the most basic decisions about who you love.	
Amendment K Modify Constitutional Election Deadlines	<ul> <li>What it Does: Adds an extra 7 days for County Clerks to finalize ballots, extends period for publishing ballot measures from 15 to 45 days.</li> <li>Why We Support It: County Clerks need more time to ensure accuracy of our ballots.</li> </ul>	
Proposition JJ Sports Betting Tax Revenue	<ul> <li>What it Does: Asks if the state can keep tax revenue over \$29 million for water conservation rather than returning it to taxpayers.</li> <li>Why We Support It: Water conservation is critical to Colorado's healthy future.</li> </ul>	
Amendment 80 School Choice in K-12 Education	<ul> <li>What it Does: Amends the constitution to include religious, charter, private, and homeschooling as school options, opening them to public school funding.</li> <li>Why We Oppose It: Public funds should be for public schools, and school choice already exists in Colorado.</li> </ul>	X

Proposition 131	What it Does: Creates an all-party primary for certain elected offices, and a ranked-choice voting system.	
Concerning the Conduct of Elections	<b>Why We Oppose It:</b> Ranked-choice voting is great, just not this way. It will confuse voters and allow more big money to influence elections.	X
